

Traffic Circles

In November 2002, the City Council approved the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Policy to aid citizens in resolving traffic problems in residential areas by encouraging citizen involvement in neighborhood traffic management activities. Since that time, the City has been working to aggressively address concerns regarding neighborhood traffic and speed. To date, the



City has installed thirteen traffic calming devices in 6 neighborhoods.

One of the traffic calming devices that has been installed in Auburn neighborhoods is the traffic circle. Currently, traffic circles are at the intersections of Windway Road and Kentwood Drive, Azalea Drive and Peachtree Lane, Boulder Lane and Bedrock Drive, and Asheton Lane and Ashe Court.

Traffic calming circles, functioning as miniature roundabouts, redirect cut-through traffic, reduce speed, and reduce the number and severity of accidents. The devices have effectively reduced speeds in each of the locations. The newest traffic circles in Auburn can be found in Asheton Park. Since installation, each location with a traffic circle has seen a 9-10 mph reduction in speed. Working with the City, Asheton Park residents were able to come up with a viable solution to their neighborhood traffic concerns that was efficient, effective, and aesthetically pleasing.

While traffic circles are an effective means of slowing down vehicular traffic, there are several rules for maneuvering around them that drivers should keep in mind so that they are utilized to their fullest extent:

- All roads approaching the circle are marked with yield signs. Drivers approaching the circle should yield to traffic already in the circle.
- · If two vehicles arrive at the circle at the same time, the vehicle to the right goes first.
- The recommended speed for a traffic circle is 15 mph. This speed is recommended because it allows motorists to maneuver the intersection slowly enough to yield to the vehicles already in the circle.
- When making a left turn, drivers must go all the way around the circle before turning left.

Traffic circles are a safe and effective means for slowing traffic in residential neighborhoods when drivers understand the rules to maneuver the device. For more information on traffic calming devices, please contact the City's Traffic Engineer, Brandy Ezelle, at 501-3029.



City to Hold General Municipal Election on August 22

The City of Auburn's General Municipal Election will be held on Tuesday, August 22. Voters will elect a Mayor and eight Council members, one from each of the City's eight single-member wards.

If you are unable to vote at the polls on Election Day, you may apply for an absentee ballot under one of the following conditions:

- 1. If you will be out of the county or the state on election day;
- If you have a physical illness, infirmity, or handicap which prevents you from getting to the polls:
- If you are enrolled as a student at an educational institution located outside Lee County and cannot get to the polls on election day
- If you are a member, spouse or dependent of a member of the armed forces of the United States in which case you may apply under the provision of "The Federal Voting Assistance Act;" and
- If you are appointed as an election officer or named as a poll watcher at a polling place other than your regular polling place.

Applications for absentee ballots will be accepted through August

 Applications must be made in writing to the Acting City Manager and either hand delivered or mailed to:

The application form must be signed by the applicant. Applications may be obtained from City Hall and must state the applicant's name, residence address, and other information necessary to verify the applicant as a registered voter, and the address to which the ballot should be mailed. Absentee ballots will be mailed to those persons who have made a proper application as soon as the ballots are printed. The completed ballots may be filed with the Acting City Manager up to and including Election Day on August 22.

Candidates who wish to qualify for the positions of Mayor and/or Councilmember for the eight-single member wards may do so Thursday, July 6 through Tuesday, July 18 at 5:00 p.m.

Protect Yourself from Urban Wildlife

The City of Auburn's Environmental Services Department and its Animal Control Division work to keep Auburn citizens safe from wildlife such as foxes and coyotes in residential areas. Citizens can take steps to ensure their safety and the safety of their families in a number of ways, including eliminating food and shelter sources for the animals. The Animal Control Division suggests the following steps to help keep wildlife away from your home:

- . Keep pet food and water dishes indoors, especially at night.
- · Securely fasten all garbage containers.
- · Keep garage doors closed.
- Never feed squirrels, raccoons, or other species that may become a problem.

Urban wildlife tends to like cool, dry, dark places. Take a look around your property to make sure that such places do not exist. Openings under houses, porches, and sheds are very popular places. If you find such places during your check around your property, make sure no animals are actually using these places and then seal them off.

Citizens should never attempt to interact with or remove wildlife from any area. If you are experiencing problems with these animals, contact the Animal Control Division immediately at 501-3090. For after-hours situations, please contact the City's non-emergency after-hours number at 501-3100.




